We look forward to his being with us to speak Friday evening at the banquet and Saturday morning at our Key Member breakfast. Saturday at noon, our own Past International President Lion Ebb Grindstaff will be our speaker. Both men will have a lot to offer us.

Originally we had planned to include Saturday night, but again, with the price of the hotels/motels in San Angelo due to the oil drilling we decided one night for those who must stay would be best. We hope to see many of you at the banquet Friday night or the activities on Saturday. And now let me give you some numbers. I know everyone wants to keep up with the numbers because numbers represent how much humanitarian service we can provide as well as helping us see the strength of our district. The good news is, as of today (March 19), we have added 103 new members.

Lions Clubs International Century of Service Commemorative Coin Act signed into law!

In recognition of our 100th Anniversary in 2017, LCI led efforts to have 400,000 silver dollar commemorative coins minted by the U.S. Treasury. Sales of the coins will raise millions to support our global mission areas for the visually impaired, disabled, youth and those affected by disaster. Lions from all over the globe are exploring similar commemorative campaigns locally.

Through the hard work and grassroots advocacy of many Lions, the "Lions Clubs International Century of Service Commemorative Coin Act," S. 1299/H.R. 2139 achieved 295 sponsors and co-sponsors in the U.S. House of Representatives and 70 sponsors and co-sponsors in the U.S. Senate before its passage by Congress. **President Barack Obama signed the Lions Clubs International Century of Service Commemorative Coin Act into law on October 5, 2012!**

Once available, LCI Commemorative Coins can be purchased through the <u>United States Mint</u> in 2017. The U.S. Mint will begin working with LCI in 2015 on the design of the coin, and in 2016 the U.S. Mint will begin making plans for marketing the 2017 coin. As details such as the design and the date of sale become available, LCI will post to this page. Any inquiries about the LCI Century of Service Commemorative Coin can be sent to LCI government relations.

William J. Crawford, of Encinitas, California, USA, was elected to serve a two- year term as a director of The International Association of Lions Clubs at the association's 87th International Convention, held in Detroit, Michigan, USA/Windsor, Ontario, Canada, July 5-July 9, 2004.

Past Director Crawford is an attorney.

A member of the West Covina Lions Club since 1979, Past Director Crawford has held many offices within the association, including club president, district governor and multiple district council chairperson. Additionally, he was an international board appointee, a nominations committee member, convention parliamentarian, convention resolutions committee member, leadership institute chairperson, leadership institute faculty member and USA/Canada Forum Committee member and speaker.

In recognition of his service to the association he has received numerous awards, including Cub of the Year, Monarch of the Year, 100% Club President Award, 23 years of Perfect Attendance, City of Hope-Life Sustainer Award and the Dwight Stanford Fellowship Award. Past Director Crawford has received two Proclamation Awards, 10 District Governor Appreciation Awards, a 50-Member Master Key, four President's Awards, three Leadership Medals and the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest award bestowed upon association members. He is also a Melvin Jones Fellow.

In addition to his Lions activities, Past Director Crawford is active in numerous professional and community organizations, including the Knights of Columbus, American Subcontractors Association, Cal Poly State University president's council, Association General Contractors, Army & Navy Academy legal advisor, AYSO Soccer Board of Directors, West Covina Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors. He is preeminent rated with the American Bar Association, received a humanitarian award from Archbishop Timothy Manning and was named the Chamber of Commerce Small Business Person of the Year.

Past Director Crawford and his wife, Julie, who is also a Melvin Jones Fellow and member of the Encinitas Lions Club, have three children.




Kingsland Lions Win Big at Chamber of Commerce



District 2-A1 Club Contest 2013-2014 July 1, 2013 through March 31, 2014

The Clubs will be divided into two "Divisions": Division One (those clubs with 24 members and less) and Division Two (those clubs with 25 members and more). Club size will be determined by the official Lions International count (MMR) as of the July 1, 2013 billing. This is the same starting number that will be used in the "membership" point category below. If a club grows or shrinks into a different Division, they will still be scored and judged by the rules of their starting/original Division. The winning Club in each Division will receive \$250 for its administrative fund awarded at the District Convention in San Angelo, however a Club may expend it as a charitable donation, if they so choose. There will also be a trophy or standard awarded, that can be used as bragging rights for the next year at all District Functions.

Points and Rules

As we "Join Hands and Lift Others" - 100% Participation in all District Lions Charities will garner a club 250 Points. 200% will get 400 Points (an additional 150 points) and for each additional 100% from 300% and on will get an additional 100 Points. (for example, 300% will get 500 points, 400% will get 600 points, etc) The District Treasurer (PDG Lion Joyce Downie) will award these points, based on donations received. Make sure all contributions go through the Treasurer to get your points.

Membership - 50 Points for each new member added. 100 Points for each new member added in a month in which the Club's beginning count for that month was +5 over the July 1st number. Minus 75 Points for each member lost (except through death or major illness) and minus 100 Points for each "new member" lost (i.e. one brought in on or after July 1, 2013 and terminated before March 31, 2014). A special form to be sent to the District Secretary will be provided so you can obtain these points.

Visitations -100 Points for an inter-Club visitation in any Club in any Texas District within 70 miles of the visiting club's meeting location; 200 Points from 71 to 150 miles; 300 Points over 150 miles. An official visitation will constitute at least 2 active members of a club of 30 or less; and 4 active members of 31 or more. The visiting Club will need to provide/mail a visitation note/report from Host Club to the District Secretary. No points will be counted for any report received by the District Secretary after March 31, 2014.

20 points will be awarded for each member visiting a Club outside of MD2 (Texas). An official visitation report from the Club visited must be presented to the District Secretary.

District Participation-100 Points for each of the President, Secretary (Secretary/Treasurer), or 1st Vice-President's attendance at any of the Cabinet Meetings or Mid-winter Conference, 50 Points for any other Club officer or Board Member, 25 Points any other member; Also, 100 Points for having their President at their own Zone Meetings; 25 Points for any other member in attendance. These points will be awarded by the District Secretary or Zone Chair based on attendance reports from the meetings. (Zone Chairs will file Zone meeting reports to the District Secretary after each Zone meeting, making special note of the numbers from each club in attendance.)

Extension-500 Points for Sponsoring a new Lions Club or 300 Points for forming a new Leos Club with charter papers submitted prior to March 31, 2014. For a new lions Club, these points will be awarded, if in the estimation of the District Global Membership Team Director and the District Governor Team, the sponsoring Club has actually actively participated in the development, recruitment and charter process. If this is not the case, the Club will still be awarded 200 Points for being the sponsor.

Opportunities for Youth & Peace Poster - 200 Points for each paid entry into either the Peace Poster or Diabetic Awareness Essay Contests. The Opportunities for Youth Chair (PDG Marshall Twombly) and Peace Poster Chair (Lion Scott Patterson) will award these points and submit them to the District Secretary. All entries for these contests must go through the Opportunities for Youth Chair, and Peace Poster Chair respectively.
