Now is the time for your club to start thinking of ways to honor your outgoing President or a member of your club that has gone above and beyond the call of duty to help your club accomplish the goals for the year. One way is to give them a Melvin Jones Fellow Award. This is the highest award a Lion can get in Lions Clubs International.

Most Clubs do not know that their club has monies accrued in an unnamed Melvin Jones Fellow account. This money accrues from donations made by a club over the years such as the 100% donations, disaster appeals, sightfirst 1 & 2 programs, and appeals that are Melvin Jones eligible. Please check with me to see if your club has accrued funds for a Melvin Jones Fellow.

Here are some facts about LCIF.

The Foundation relies on contributions from Lions clubs and individual members to provide the millions of dollars of support for Lions projects throughout the world each year. **LCIF does not receive support through annual club dues.**


LCIF has several recognition programs to recognize donors for their generous support. The two most common recognitions are the Contributing Member and the Melvin Jones Fellow program. The Contributing Member program is an annual program that recognizes 3 levels of support \$20.00, \$50.00 and \$100.00. The MJF program recognizes donations of \$1000.00 which can be accumulated over a number of years. For Clubs whose current members are all MJF's, the Club receives a 100 percent MJF banner. Only 338 of the more than 46,000 clubs worldwide are 100% MJF clubs. How close is your club? Contact LCIF to find out.

LCIF awarded 489 grants in 2012-2013 totaling over \$39 million for a variety of programs ranging from disaster relief to youth development to eye care services. Each year millions of people around the world benefit from projects funded by LCIF grants. Grant examples include \$9,900.00 to purchase computer equipment for a vocational training center in Paraguay and \$75,000.00 to replace a pool at Camp Echoing Hills, a special needs camp in the United States. Visit LCIF web-site to see what projects qualify for LCIF grants. LCIF provides support in four areas of service, preserving sight, serving youth, disaster relief, and humanitarian efforts.

If your club has not yet made the 100% donations to the 8 charities that District 2-A1 supports, please do so as soon as possible in order to receive credit for this year which ends June 30th.

**Lions Clubs International Century of Service  
Commemorative Coin Act signed into law!**

In recognition of our 100th Anniversary in 2017, LCI led efforts to have 400,000 silver dollar commemorative coins minted by the U.S. Treasury. Sales of the coins will raise millions to support our global mission areas for the visually impaired, disabled, youth and those affected by disaster. Lions from all over the globe are exploring similar commemorative campaigns locally.

Through the hard work and grassroots advocacy of many Lions, the "Lions Clubs International Century of Service Commemorative Coin Act," S. 1299/H.R. 2139 achieved 295 sponsors and co-sponsors in the U.S. House of Representatives and 70 sponsors and co-sponsors in the U.S. Senate before its passage by Congress. **President Barack Obama signed the Lions Clubs International Century of Service Commemorative Coin Act into law on October 5, 2012!**

Once available, LCI Commemorative Coins can be purchased through the [United States Mint](#) in 2017. The U.S. Mint will begin working with LCI in 2015 on the design of the coin, and in 2016 the U.S. Mint will begin making plans for marketing the 2017 coin. As details such as the design and the date of sale become available, LCI will post to this page.
