In Kingsland, we recently partnered with the utility district, county government, and others on the Household Waste Clean-up Event. Lion Linda Raschke describes this project and how the community benefits but more importantly how rewarding it is to her.

On behalf of Llano County, Kingsland Municipal Utility District, & Kingsland Water Supply, I would like to personally thank each and every member of the Kingsland Lions Club for all the hard work and participation in making the latest Llano County- Wide Household Waste Clean-Up Event such a tremendous success. We saw over 240 vehicles come through the collection line. We filled 2 - 18 wheel tractor trailers with tires. We had 4 - 40 yard roll-off containers with bulk items (sofas, mattresses, etc.). We had 2 - 40 yard roll-off containers with metal materials. We recycled 495 gallons of paint. We also recycled 330 gallons of oil, 55 gallons of anti-freeze, and 2 truck loads of electronics.

Being a member of the Kingsland Lions Club has been an honor for many reasons. The friendship I now have are invaluable to me. The dedication to public service truly surpasses that of any organization that I have been affiliated. When we live in a small community, it really takes people who are willing to donate their time and effort to the betterment of the community. TEXAS LIONS LOOKING FOR CAMPERS

Texas Lions Camp is a summer camp dedicated to serving children from the state of Texas with physical disabilities, type-1 diabetes and cancer between the ages of seven and sixteen. The camp is a modern facility located on over 500 acres outside of Kerrville in the beautiful Texas Hill Country. Texas Lions Camp offers campers a chance to try new activities and create long lasting friendships while developing greater self-esteem, independence, and most of all, they get to have FUN! Children eligible for the Texas Lions Camp summer program includes children age 7 to 16 with physical disabilities. Eligible children include, but are not limited to, children who are hearing impaired or deaf, visually impaired or blind, have a missing limb, birth defects, cerebral palsy, arthritis, muscular dystrophy, cancer, asthma, heart conditions and others. One camp session is for children with Down syndrome ages 12 to 16. Two sessions are provided for children who have type-1 diabetes ages 8 to 15.

Learning can take on many forms and Texas Lions Camp is a unique experience for many campers in the types of challenges presented. Counselors are assigned to each group of campers and escort them throughout the session, teaching and encouraging campers while meeting their special needs. Another key lesson is learning that everyone has a 'disability'; some are just more obvious than others

The goal of Texas Lions Camp is to help children become more independent, productive adults. The programs of the Texas Lions Camp are intended to develop such qualities as improved self-image, social adjustment and self-reliance. These services are offered to campers at no charge to them or their families.
