

Article by Jennifer Taylor about her Lions International Youth Exchange trip to Belgium in July. She was sponsored jointly by Midland Downtown and Midland Suburban Lions Clubs. Jennifer is now a senior at Midland Lee High School.







Belgium is a place that keeps its ties with the past even though it is the capital of the European Union and a country of the twenty-first century. It does this by having the architecture of every building in the style of the eighteenth century. The Midland Downtown and Suburban Lions Clubs jointly sent me there as part of the Lions International Youth Exchange program. The Lions Clubs sent me to Belgium for four weeks. The first and last week I spent with two different host families and the two weeks in between I spent in the Belgium Pallieter Youth camp.

In the camp there were thirty-four exchange students from twenty-six different countries and in it we toured Belgium and even visited another country, Luxemburg, for two days. The camp was in Lier, a city in the northern Dutch-speaking part of Belgium, and from there we rode a bus to visit cities around the country. One of the cities we visited was Brussels, the capital of the country and of the European Union. There we visited the Atomium, the model of element that has now become a symbol of Belgium, and toured the Parliament building and the Royal Palace. We also visited Brugge, the most romantic city in Belgium, where we took a boat ride in the river that winds its way through the city. Another great city was Antwerp, the city of hands, so named because there was a legend that giants had taken over and the hero only defeated them after severing the hand of the biggest giant. In the city we took a two hour bike tour and then had free time. During the camp we spent two days in Luxemburg where we took a city tour and had to explore the city in groups. These are only a few things we did during the camp because to recount them all would take a lifetime.

Before the camp I stayed with a really nice family together with another exchange student from Finland. This was in Lens-Saint Remy, the southern French-speaking part of the country. They made sure that the places they took us would not be repeated during our time in the camp. This was great because the country is really small and because of this it is hard to see different things in four weeks. With that family I went to Hans, the only place in Belgium with caverns and an animal preserve, and we got up close and personal with wild horses and other such animals. The family also took us to see different historical sites and to witness the Tour de France. After the camp two other exchange students, one from Brazil and another from Mexico, and I stayed with a great family that lived in Brugge, a city in the northern Belgium where they spoke Dutch. Unfortunately, while we were there it rained, so we didn't get to see much but they showed us the non-tourist side with the different culture and all the local haunts.

This trip to Belgium was amazing. It helped me learn about a different culture that was so different from the culture of the U.S. I am so thankful to the Midland Downtown and Suburban Lions Clubs for sponsoring my trip so that I could have this once in a lifetime experience. It was a great learning experience and I hope that I could someday experience something like this again.



What "re-MEMBER Texas" is all about

What a fantastic story in the July/August Lion magazine ("From Four to Full Bore", pg.44). "Down to just 4 members, a club in a small North Dakota Town rebounds thanks to Facebook and an old-fashioned, father – and – son chat." This is not just a story of a recruiting drive, taking a Lions Club from near extinction (like many of our own Clubs) to 30 members with an average age of 33 in less than a year. No, this is the story of a club that figured out what it took to attract new members into their old, dying club and reinvented themselves into a vibrant club that is relevant to its community again – rebuilt itself into a club that will retain these new members because the club has a purpose which is meaningful to a younger generation.

So what is "re-MEMBER Texas" and how does it fit into this success story? re-MEMBER Texas is a membership plan put together by your Council of Governors for 2015-16 to help the Clubs of Texas rebuild. re-MEMBER Texas is a battle cry for all Texas clubs, just as remember the Alamo was our Texas battle cry 180 years ago. It is built around three main tenets: Recruit, Retain, & Rebuild. re-MEMBER Texas is a tool box full of ideas to help Club leaders make a plan, involve your members, examine your purpose for existing in your community, and rebuilding your club into something that attracts members.

For years, since Texas membership started sliding from 45,000 members to its 26,000 today, each new group of District Governors, Club Presidents, and other leaders come in and exhort you to get more members and keep the ones you have. How for the most part has been left up to you. This year's Council has the same cry, but wanted to give Club leaders a TOOL BOX (the re-MEMBER Texas Kit) to work with.

Are you a Club president or Membership Chairperson and don't know what I'm talking about? Each District Governor may approach the delivery of this material in a different way, but if you don't have yours yet, there is no need to wait. Get on the NEW rebuilt Texas website (www.texaslions.org) and click on the re-MEMBER Texas button. Open up the re-MEMBER Texas News, a newspaper that will tell you all about re-MEMBER Texas. All items in the kit are explained on page 8, including how you can order them for yourself from LCI. Then call your District Governor and ask him/her when you can get going on the re-MEMBER Texas coin/wooden nickel program. If you need help, set up a date with the DG Team to sit down and help you build a plan.

As with the small club in the story, getting new members will NOT solve your problem by itself. It is the 3 pronged attack of re-MEMBER Texas: recruit the right people and rebuild/reinvent your club with retention of these new members in mind. If you will attack the problem with energy & enthusiasm like they did, making use of the tools in the re-MEMBER Texas Kit and the help of your District Leadership, "Four to Full Bore" will be the success story for hundreds of Texas Lions Clubs this year. Will you be one?

State Convention Coming to 2A1

Every 16 years, District 2A1 gets the opportunity to show off Lionism in District 2A1 by hosting the State Convention. Last time it was held in San Angelo under the capable leadership of then Council Chairperson, John Hancock. This time it will be held in Midland (May 19-21, 2016). That's right 2016!

However, if we want to have a great convention in 2A1, we have to start planning now. One of the goals of next year's Council of Governors is to make this convention even more appealing to the grassroots Lions in Texas. For the last 3 years the Councils have been trying to offer things to attract younger members to see what Texas Lionism is really all about. You'll see what we mean as we unfold our agenda over the next several months.

For now, we are asking for your support as we begin phase 1 of our promotion. As you may know, your own 1st Vice-District Governor, A.J. Dolle, is a newspaper publisher. So in order to promote Midland as the site of our State Convention in May 2016, we plan to publish a full size (minimum) 6 page newspaper to distribute at this year's State Convention, our Council meetings next year, and to deliver throughout the State using our 16 District Governors. It will also be emailed to all clubs and Lions across the State, as well as being posted on the State website.

The newspaper will be full of information about, banquets, entertainment, seminars, special events and guest speakers, as well as, interactive seminars designed to convince grassroots Lions they ought to come see what's going on. The paper will be in color with plenty of pictures of the hotel, convention venue, and other places of interest for visitors.

We are asking for <u>Clubs and/or Lions</u> to buy support ads in the paper, welcoming the rest of Texas Lions to 2A1 in 2016. The business card size ads are \$50 (or any higher amount you wish to donate to help out). Any ads purchased will also appear in a second edition to be printed for the Convention, and also in a special membership newspaper being prepared by next year's Council of Governors. As you can see, your support will help us in many ways. Larger ads (up to a full page) are also available.

The Lions Environmental Photo Contest provides a way for Lions to portray, through an original photo, their pride and commitment to improving, protecting and preserving the environment. Every Lion from a club in good standing can enter a photograph of his or her immediate surroundings into the club-level Lions Environmental Photo Contest.

This year District 2A1 will host a District Environmental Photo Contest at our Mid-Winter Conference in Ballinger. The rules for the contest & entry form are in this newsletter. Any Lion in District 2A1 may submit a picture and although 2A1 may only forward one winner to the State contest, we will allow multiple entries from an individual Lion. The Lions of 2A1 will vote on the best overall photo, regardless of the category the photographer has chosen. (The category is only used once a Texas winner is selected and sent to the International Contest.) Lions from around the world will select the final winners at the International Convention in Fukuoka, Japan next June. Send your entries with your entry form to our District Secretary: Lion Randi Rivero, 3518 Shady Hill, San Angelo, Tx 76904 prior to the Mid-Winter Conference (Jan 22-23)

These photos are last year's winners in the various categories (top left: Grand Prize winner). There are no prizes - just the pride in having your picture seen by Lions around the world and being featured in the Lions Environmental Calendar. Texas has had some International winners, this year let's make it an A1 winner.

Texas Lions from clubs in good standing can enter an original, unaltered, black-and-white or color photo (without people) of the environment of their Lions club in the following 2015-2016 Lions Environmental Photo Contest categories:

- Animal Life
- Landscape (urban or natural)
- Plant Life
- Weather Phenomenon
- Special Theme: Dignity, harmony, humanity: Celebrating the peaceful coexistence of species.

The impartial judging of photos should focus on originality, artistic merit, and portrayal of the environmental theme.

- LIONS CLUBS select and submit one winning photo to the district.
- LIONS DISTRICTS select and submit one 8" x 10" printed photo to the multiple district prior to February 4, 2016. Photos may be mailed to reach the state office prior to this date or delivered to the contest coordinator in Kerrville Thursday, February 4th.
- LIONS MULTIPLE DISTRICTS select and submit one winning photo to the international contest.
 March 1, 2016 is the deadline for multiple districts to submit one 8" x 10" printed photograph and an official entry form (available on the Lions Web site) signed by the council chairperson to Lions Headquarters.
- LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL will display multiple district-level entries at the annual Lions international convention. Registered convention attendees will vote for their favorite photos. An award will be presented to the winning photographers. The six (the five category winners and the Best of Show) winning photos will appear on the Lions Web site.

NOTE: Multiple entries will not be accepted, please limit to one photo entry per district.
