The Halfway Point





No club has to be an island...



The District Meeting in Kingsland was a success in many ways thanks to the attendance and participation of many of you. We wanted to recap the program covering "Service to our Communities". The official minutes will come from the District secretary.

#### Speakers:

Publicity -be proud of your service activities and publish in you local newspapers - use a font of 12 or more - the headline needs to be catchy - keep it short - send PDF file to paper

Shared projects - look at projects that the communities needs done but are too big for your club but can be shared with other organization in the community - churches, other service organizations, scouts, school, county/city government.

As we get older we might not be able to take on the service activities we did in the past but we need to encourage the younger members to step forward and carry the flag.

Service projects shared by clubs, listed from fewest lions required to most:

Western Texas Eye Bank - Signing up cornea donors at fund raisers and service projects - 1 lions 1 hour - no cost

Lions Camp Spring Work days - 1 lion 1 day - no cost

Colorado City Lions - Help individuals with food, eye glasses, utilities, medical & collage scholarships - people served varies as does cost and lions time

Llano Lions- Listening to school children read - 1 lion 1 hour a week - no cost

**Llano, Mason, Sweetwater Lions** - vision screening and help with glasses - from 1 to 10 lions, from \$4,000 to \$7,000 depending on school size - takes 3 to 10 hours depending on school size.

Kingsland Lions - float in 4th of July Parade - 10 lions, 50 hours - \$100

**Miles Lions** - Community support projects including cemetery maintenance, street signs, flag holders for graves of veterans, food bank, "chain crew" at football games, & eye glasses - 20 lions and 100 hours - cost is variable

Ballinger Noon Lions - Thanksgiving food baskets - serve 150 families - 15 lions & 15 hours - \$1,400

Midland Downtown Lions- Texas Ramp Project - builds ramps at individual houses where a person is confined to a wheel chair and needs a ramp to enter and leave their house - 19 lions have participated in building 5 ramp so far this year

San Angelo Concho Pearl Lions - Meals for the Elderly - provide a meal for elderly for weekend - 7 lions 15 hours each week.

San Angelo Downtown Lions - Helping Hands to repair houses - a shared service project with the community - 15 lions have volunteered 6 hours each this year - cost \$200

San Angelo North by Northwest Lions - Juneteenth Celebration - coordinates community event and serves food - 50 lions and volunteers contribute 200 hours and \$3,500

Midland West Side Lions - Back to school bash - partners with other community groups - provide 1,000 bags of school supplies - 50 lions and volunteers contribute 500 hours and \$5,000

### **State Convention Coming to 2A1**

Every 16 years, District 2A1 gets the opportunity to show off Lionism in District 2A1 by hosting the State Convention. Last time it was held in San Angelo under the capable leadership of then Council Chairperson, John Hancock. This time it will be held in Midland (May 19-21, 2016). That's right 2016!

However, if we want to have a great convention in 2A1, we have to start planning now. One of the goals of next year's Council of Governors is to make this convention even more appealing to the grassroots Lions in Texas. For the last 3 years the Councils have been trying to offer things to attract younger members to see what Texas Lionism is really all about. You'll see what we mean as we unfold our agenda over the next several months.

For now, we are asking for your support as we begin phase 1 of our promotion. As you may know, your own 1<sup>st</sup> Vice-District Governor, A.J. Dolle, is a newspaper publisher. So in order to promote Midland as the site of our State Convention in May 2016, we plan to publish a full size (minimum) 6 page newspaper to distribute at this year's State Convention, our Council meetings next year, and to deliver throughout the State using our 16 District Governors. It will also be emailed to all clubs and Lions across the State, as well as being posted on the State website.

The newspaper will be full of information about, banquets, entertainment, seminars, special events and guest speakers, as well as, interactive seminars designed to convince grassroots Lions they ought to come see what's going on. The paper will be in color with plenty of pictures of the hotel, convention venue, and other places of interest for visitors.

We are asking for <u>Clubs and/or Lions</u> to buy support ads in the paper, welcoming the rest of Texas Lions to 2A1 in 2016. ### MD2 STATE CONVENTION COLLEGE STATION, TEXAS MAY 22, 2015

#### OFFICIAL STATE CONVENTION CALL

THE ANNUAL STATE CONVENTION OF MULTIPLE DISTRICT TWO (TEXAS) SHALL BE CONVENED AT THE TIMES AND PLACES OF THE SIXTEEN DISTRICT CONVENTIONS OF MULTIPLE DISTRICT TWO FOR THE PURPOSE ONLY OF VOTING ON ANY AND ALL ITEMS APPROVED FOR THE MULTIPLE DISTRICT TWO (TEXAS) BALLOT. THE STATE CONVENTION WILL THEN BE RECESSED TO BE RECONVENED ON THE 22nd DAY OF MAY AT COLLEGE STATION, TEXAS.

EACH CHARTERED CLUB IN THE STATE IN GOOD STANDING WITH LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL, STATE, AND DISTRICT DUES PAID TO DATE, ARE HEREBY NOTIFIED THAT THEY ARE ENTITLED TO ONE (1) VOTING DELEGATE AND ONE (1) ALTERNATE FOR EACH TEN (10) MEMBERS OF SAID CLUB, OR MAJOR FRACTION THEREOF, AS SHOWN BY THE RECORDS OF LIONS INTERNATIONAL ON THE FIRST DAY OF THE MONTH LAST PRECEDING THAT MONTH DURING WHICH THE CONVENTION IS HELD. THE MAJOR FRACTION REFERRED TO SHALL BE FIVE (5) OR MORE MEMBERS. ONLY REGISTERED DELEGATES WITH CERTIFIED CREDENTIALS, PRESENT IN PERSON AT ANY MEETING OF THE CONVENTION, SHALL BE ENTITLED TO VOTE. ELIGIBLE DELEGATES ARE MEMBERS WHO HAVE BEEN ENROLLED FOR AT LEAST ONE (1) YEAR AND A DAY IN THE CLUB AS SHOWN BY THE RECORDS OF THE INTERNATIONAL OFFICE AS COUNTED FOR PURPOSES OF CALCULATING DELEGATE ENTITLEMENT. EACH SUCH DELEGATE MAY CAST ONLY ONE (1) VOTE ON EACH QUESTION.

THE PHRASE "MEMBERS" WHO HAVE BEEN ENROLLED FOR AT LEAST ONE (1) YEAR AND A DAY IN THE CLUB IS INTERPRETED TO MEAN THE FOLLOWING:

A TRANSFEREE SHALL BE COUNTED AS A MEMBER FOR THE PURPOSE OF CALCULATING THE DELEGATE ENTITLEMENT OF THE CLUB IF THE TRANSFEREE HAS BEEN A MEMBER OR RECEIVED TRANSFER FOR AT LEAST ONE (1) YEAR AND ONE (1) DAY.

A REINSTATED MEMBER SHALL BE COUNTED AS A MEMBER FOR THE PURPOSE OF CALCULATING THE CLUBS DELEGATE ENTITLEMENT PROVIDED THAT THE REINSTATED MEMBER HAS BEEN A MEMBER FOR AN AGGREGATE PERIOD OF NOT LESS THAT ONE (1) YEAR AND ONE (1) DAY.

A NEWLY CHARTERED CLUB WILL BE ENTITLED TO ONE (1) DELEGATE AND ONE (1) ALTERNATE DELEGATE UNTIL IT HAS BEEN CHARTERED FOR ONE (1) YEAR AND ONE (1) DAY. THEREAFTER, THE DELEGATE QUOTA WILL BE BASED ON THE NUMBER OF MEMBERS ENROLLED IN THE CLUB FOR ONE (1) YEAR AND ONE (1) DAY.

CLUBS BEING RELEASED FROM STATUS QUO WILL HAVE THEIR DELEGATE QUOTA BASED ON THE NUMBER OF MEMBERS ENROLLED IN THE CLUB FOR ONE (1) YEAR AND ONE (1) DAY AT THE TIME OF BEING RELEASED FROM STATUS QUO. HOWEVER, A CLUB BEING RELEASED FROM STATUS QUO WILL BE ENTITLED TO A MINIMUM OF ONE (1) DELEGATE, AND ONE (1) ALTERNATE DELEGATE.
