

TEXAS LIONS LOOKING FOR CAMPERS FOR 2016

Texas Lions Camp is a summer camp dedicated to serving children from the state of Texas with physical disabilities, type-1 diabetes and cancer between the ages of seven and sixteen. This past summer 1520 children from across Texas enjoyed a fun filled week at camp. The camp is a modern facility located on over 500 acres outside of Kerrville in the beautiful Texas Hill Country. Texas Lions Camp offers campers a chance to try new activities and create long lasting friendships while developing greater self-esteem, independence, and most of all, they get to have FUN! Children eligible for the Texas Lions Camp summer program includes children age 7 to 16 with physical disabilities. Eligible children include, but are not limited to, children who are hearing impaired or deaf, visually impaired or blind, have a missing limb, birth defects, cerebral palsy, arthritis, muscular dystrophy, cancer, asthma, heart conditions and others. One camp session is for children with Down syndrome ages 12 to 16. Two sessions are provided for children who have type-1 diabetes ages 8 to 15.

Learning can take on many forms and Texas Lions Camp is a unique experience for many campers in the types of challenges presented. Counselors are assigned to each group of campers and escort them throughout the session, teaching and encouraging campers while meeting their special needs. Another key lesson is learning that everyone has a 'disability'; some are just more obvious than others

The goal of Texas Lions Camp is to help children become more independent, productive adults. The programs of the Texas Lions Camp are intended to develop such qualities as improved self-image, social adjustment and self-reliance. These services are offered to campers at no charge to them or their families.

Now is the time for your club to start thinking of ways to honor your outgoing President or a member of your club that has gone above and beyond the call of duty to help your club accomplish the goals for the year. One way is to give them a Melvin Jones Fellow Award. This is the highest award a Lion can get in Lions Clubs International.

Most Clubs do not know that their club has monies accrued in an unnamed Melvin Jones Fellow account. This money accrues from donations made by a club over the years such as the 100% donations, disaster appeals, sight first 1 & 2 programs, and appeals that are Melvin Jones eligible.

Please check with me to see if your club has accrued funds for a Melvin Jones Fellow.

Here are some facts about LCIF.

The Foundation relies on contributions from Lions clubs and individual members to provide the millions of dollars of support for Lions projects throughout the world each year. LCIF does not receive support through annual club dues.

LCIF has several recognition programs to recognize donors for their generous support. The two most common recognitions are the Contributing Member and the Melvin Jones Fellow program. The Contributing Member program is an annual program that recognizes 3 levels of support \$20.00, \$50.00 and \$100.00. The MJF program recognizes donations of \$1000.00 which can be accumulated over a number of years. For Clubs whose current members are all MJF's, the Club receives a 100 percent MJF banner. Only 338 of the more than 46,000 clubs worldwide are 100% MJF clubs. How close is your club? Contact LCIF to find out.

Since LCIF began in 1968, it has awarded more than 12,072 grants totaling more than \$900 million. Together, Lions and LCIF are making a difference for millions of people. Texas has received several of these grants.

If your club has not yet made the 100% donations to the 8 charities that District 2-A1 supports, please do so as soon as possible in order to receive credit for this year which ends June 30th.

re-MEMBER Texas - start from the foundation & go up from there

Last month we addressed the 2nd very important part of the **retention** puzzle: Making them feel <u>needed</u> & <u>useful</u> in the service goals of your club. Your club must have meaningful projects with project chairmen, who will involve your new members and are open to suggestions & new ideas. The other part to retention, which we discussed a month earlier, is your personal responsibility in "keeping 'em" - making them feel <u>wanted</u>.

If your club doesn't really have any true "service" projects (maybe you are just into fund raisers), or your projects are no longer relevant to your community in today's world, you are not going to keep new Lions in your club, especially younger ones. This leads us to the 3rd prong of our "re-MEMBER Texas" plan: rebuild. Like the other 2 prongs (recruit & retain), which we have discussed over the last 4 months, rebuilding also has 2 distinct parts. Like any building project there is the exterior façade that all can see, but rebuilding the outside is worthless, if the foundation is weak.

For those who have not been keeping up, re-MEMBER Texas is our Texas membership plan for 2015-16. The plan is built around three main tenets: Recruit, Retain, & Rebuild. The re-MEMBER Texas kit contains two important pieces in it to help you with your recruiting plan: The re-MEMBER Texas News, a 14 page newspaper full of ideas & several guides for your club. The re-MEMBER Texas News can also be found on the Texas website www.texaslions.org.

When you stick doggedly to "the way we've always done it", you likely have trouble recruiting and retaining members. Rebuilding a Lions club starts with looking at your club and analyzing how well your club fits your members in today's world. It requires an in-depth, soul-searching analysis of whom & what your club is. It requires surveys of community needs, plus input from the membership about their needs & wants. Lions Club International has several fantastic tools to help your club maneuver through this process. Two of these guides are included in your "re-MEMBER Texas" kit: Your Club, Your Way, and Blueprint for a Stronger Club. If you didn't get your kit, talk to your District Governor, or go to the Texas MD2 Website and review the "re-MEMBER Texas" News for full details on how to use the guides and how to get your copies directly from LCI. Also found in the newspaper is an in-depth discussion of the Club Excellence Process (Pro & Lite), a third "excellent" analysis tool.

Many clubs are afraid of this process and what it might show, because it likely will mean the most disastrous thing that can happen to a seasoned Lion: **CHANGE**! If you are living in the past and fail to make your club attractive to the younger generations, you can't survive, and who is the loser in that? --- All the people you serve.

Some clubs think they can clean up the façade; make it look good on the outside and hope it works, but if the foundation is weak, the house will collapse like a house of cards. Sadly only a few clubs will actually bare their souls and analyze what they can do. These clubs will be successful in entering the 21st century. They will attract & retain many quality Lions for 2nd Century. Will you be one of them?

Progress Causing Upheaval in Downtown Midland Original Convention Venue

No Longer Tenable

Major demolition projects by the City of Midland over the next few months will make room for a new Convention Center, more hotels and additional parking in the middle of downtown. The projects are directly across the street and surrounding the original Texas Lions host hotel.

The demolition includes tearing down the current Midland Center, which would have been the site for several of the meals. seminars & workshops of the 2016 MD2 State Convention. In addition to the construction disturbance, the loss of the center would require using other venues some distance away. The original hotel is also using the opportunity to eliminate the majority of its attached parking spaces to make room for a 3 story parking garage. They will make use of the Convention Center parking 2 blocks away, since this will be unused during construction of the new center.

The Convention Committee felt that having to frequently drive to other venues when the parking would be blocks away from the hotel would not make the convention very pleasant. The committee decided to select an alternate site.

Combining the two, the 2016 State Convention in Midland will contain 3 Action Projects, giving club leaders, committee chairs, and club members the chance to learn new ways to serve with hands on experience allowing them to go back to their communities and put these new projects into ACTION.

Using the system and building templates (that can be used for any configuration) of the Texas Ramp Project, you will learn how to take a "pre-vetted" lead in your town, develop a site plan, and then actually build a ramp. The classroom seminar starts Thursday (1 PM) at the hotel. The crew will pre-build and then assemble a ramp on location throughout Friday & Saturday with time allotted to attend the meals and hear the special speakers. Bring work clothes. Texas Lions State Convention - Childcare Registration
