Management or Leadership – We often use these two terms interchangeably but they are very different. Management has the ability to make decisions and tell the organization what the decision is and what we are going to do. Lions have **no "Management"**. We have a constitution and bylaws that both guide us and restrict us. Lion Tom Blasé likes to use a pyramid when he inducts officers, where the Lions pyramid has the point at the bottom rather than at the top. The message is the club president is not the boss but the servant of the club.

I've made this comment before, but in Lions every member is equal and has one vote. If you are a 30 year member and president you get one vote and if you just joined this week you get one vote. This is important when it comes to retaining members. All members need to have an opportunity to participate in the decisions on where the club is going and feel like they have some ownership in the decision.

Good Leadership Some of the characteristics of good leadership. Leadership implies you are going somewhere- club leaders need to be enthusiastic about where the club is going. Leaders need to make members feel included, on board and committed. In life, things are never as good as they seem or as bad, – leaders need to be always optimistic about the present and future. We are all volunteers-leaders need to make sure what volunteers give to the club is appreciated.

Who is Leadership of a club? We are. Each member of a club has some responsibility for providing leadership to the club. The club president has to set a good example. Long time members have to encourage new members. Project leaders have to include new members. New members need to step forward and take on responsibilities. A new member has just as much responsibility for recruiting another new member as the long term members.

A long time ago cartoon character coined the phrase "We have met the enemy and he is us". Strong Lions clubs work together as a team with each member taking on responsibility and appreciating the contributions of the other members.

The Brown County club has added 5 new members and the Midland West Side club has 5 members for me to induct next week. Joel Kuykendall & I have started recruiting for a new club in San Saba and have had a favorable reception by the community. It is funny, people only want to join Lions if they are asked!

Technology Education and a Masters Degree in the Education of the Blind and Visually Impaired. He has been an Industrial Technology instructor in a public school and Principal of the Ohio State School for the Blind. He served twenty years as Executive Director of the Upshaw Institute for the Blind in Detroit and received the Best Managed Non-profit Award from Crain's Business publications. He retired from the position of Superintendent at the Illinois School for the Visually Impaired.

Carroll has been a Lion since 1982. He has received two Melvin Jones Fellowship Awards and a Ken Lutsenhiser Award in recognition of his humanitarian service through Lionism.

Now retired, he enjoys spending time in his woodworking shop and reading the books he never had time for when working.

Carroll was matched with Leader Dog Will in June 2016 and together they will be traveling to represent Leader Dogs for the Blind.





HELP CELEBRATE THE CENTENNIAL OF "LIONISM"

As we approach Lion Year 2017/2018, we are coming upon the 100 year anniversary of LIONS. The exact date is October 8, 2017. We all need to remember those 44 gentlemen that met at the Adolphus Hotel in Dallas on 8 October 1917. From that meeting came the Charter for the "International Association of Lions". Times have changed since then, but our moto of "We Serve" continues to lead us today. The Texas Centennial Celebration will be held in Dallas next October 6 and 7th. Details will be provided after the first of the year. For our older clubs, look at your original Charter and see who signed it. If it was signed by Melvin Jones, I would like a copy. The copy will be framed and on display at the Celebration in Dallas. If you have any other memorabilia that you could share let me know. There will be a room with security for all items on display. Did you know that PIP Ebb is writing a book on the second 50 years of Lionism. It should be on sale by summer.

Lions International has devoted a lot of time and effort to promote the "Centennial Celebration". If you go to <u>lionsclubs.org</u> and click on Lions 100, you will can get sensory overload from all the information that is provided. The point of this is to get all our Clubs involved in the Centennial Celebration. There are several parts to the Celebration.

One of those is a <u>Centennial Community Legacy Project</u>. The purpose of this is to connect with your community by giving a visible "gift" that commemorates the Lions Centennial and creates a lasting Legacy of your service to the community. A "gift" or project does not have to be elaborate or expensive. It can be as simple as a Lions Logo sign outside of your meeting location. Projects are defined in three levels and have until June 30, 2018 to be completed. So far we have 3 completed Legacy Projects with 5 more in progress. That means that 40 of our Clubs have not worked on a Legacy Project.

A second part of the Celebration is the <u>Centennial Service Challenge</u>. This effort has been ongoing since July 2014. Many of our Club have received recognition for their efforts in 1 or all 4 of the Centennial Service Challenge areas. They are: <u>Engaging our Youth</u>: Get youth involved in the Peace Poster contest, Outstanding Youth contest, and other District Youth programs. <u>Sharing the Vision</u>: Support vision screening and educational events that discuss the medical issues that can lead to blindness. <u>Relieving the Hunger</u>: Support a local food bank, deliver meals to the elderly, support a local school "Backpack Buddies" program. <u>Protecting the Environment</u>: Protect and improve the environment to make your community a healthier place to live in. Coordinate with TXDoT and do a highway trash cleanup. Partner with others in the community to do a bulk household waste collection. Centennial Service Challenge projects can be reported each year. So far this year, only 13 Clubs have reported Service Challenge Projects to LCI. That means that 35 of our Clubs have not reported on the Service that they have done. I know that you have done more, but YOU need to report them. The LCI reporting instructions are included in the District Newsletter.

Another part of the Centennial Celebration is membership. District Governor Dave Richison is working this effort and you should have already seen the goals that he has established for the District.

Look at the LCI web page and click on Lions 100. The tool box contains tons of info.


