

Lions have been providing service in thousands of areas for the past century, and each club has participated in this worthwhile endeavor over the years. But, the old saying, "What are you doing NOW?" comes to mind. Are our efforts relevant today? Has your club considered current needs, or are you following the "calf path" by repeating age old projects because "that is what we have always done."

Governor Livingston has proposed thinking OUTSIDE THE BOX, and that is what a club should do to remain relevant in service. We often get mired in the mud of convenience by automatically repeating projects and activities year after year because we have perfected our efforts and can execute the activity without much extra effort. We should evaluate projects and activities once they are completed to determine if we are meeting current needs of our club members and community.

As your District Global Service Chair, I hope to encourage all Lions in their pursuit of service, and will remind club secretaries of their duty to report your service to the District.
