The Lions Clubs that received the new Retention Award were: El Dorado Lions Club, San Angelo North by Northwest Lions Club, and the Sweetwater Lions Club. District 2 A1 hopes to award new clubs with the Retention Awards this next quarter. The Retention program will be honored by the next two in coming Governors, 2018-2019,2019-2020. District 2 A1 is serious about retaining the old membership and recruiting new membership into our clubs.

Our special guest speaker PCC Ernesto "T.J." Tijerina spoke to the assembly about membership in Texas. He also commended District 2 A1 for being positive in membership. District 2 A1's female membership is up over 32%, which is one of our District 2 A1 goals. PCC TJ commended District 2 A1 for introducing the Retention program. He stated Lions need to always be thinking about growing membership while retaining the old membership.

Now is the time to keep working on new membership and Retention that will keep the Power of We, We Serve, benefiting those communities in need. It is also time to start thinking about our District 2 A1 Convention in San Angelo, April 27-28. The Convention's guest speaker will be Past International Director Ed Lecius and his wife Elaine from Merrimack, NH. District 2A1 Retention Contest

Last year our District lost 254 members because they decided to drop their membership in their Lions Club. The loss of these members meant we had less service in our communities, less support for our Disabled Children going to the Lions Camp, and less support for all the other good things we do.

The loss of most of these members who dropped could have been prevented. They drop for different reasons but the underlying reason is, "what they got out of being a member was not rewarding".

To encourage clubs to focus on retention, the District is implementing a retention contest. For the contest we have broken the clubs into 3 groups, Small membership, Medium membership, and Large membership. The contest will run through June 2020. The current District Governor and the District Governors for the following 2 years are committed to this program to strengthen our clubs.

Quarterly, the club with the best retention in each of the 3 size groups will be recognized at the District meeting and all the members will receive a Retention Pin. Each additional time a club wins the members will receive a chevron with a number on it representing how many time the club has won. Potentially, a club could have a chevron with 10 on it, meaning they won every quarter through June 2020.

If multiple clubs tie on having the fewest drops, we will recognize the club or clubs that tied but also have the most new members.

At the end of each year we will also recognize the club with fewest drops for the full year with an award of \$10.00 for each member. The club can decide how they want to use the money. They could use the money to buy an apparel item, have a club celebration party, take the members to a Lions Camp Friday night graduation event, or whatever fits their need.

District 2A1 Retention Contest

At the Sweetwater Mid-Winter District meeting, we recognized the first 3 clubs who had best retention for their size club. The awards were based on results for November and December. Where more than one club tied on retention we recognized the club that had the most new members for those 2 months.

Every member of the club received a vest pin. We presented the 3 clubs with a combined 108 pins. The contest goes through July 2020.

The 3 winners are:

Small clubs = Eldorado - 17 members, zero drops and 2 new members added.



Medium clubs – San Angelo North by North West – 23 members, zero drops and added 2 new members.



Large clubs – **Sweetwater** – 68 members, zero drops, and added 5 new members.

Each additional time these 3 clubs win over the next 10 quarters they will receive a chevron that goes on the pin.

At the District Convention April 27 & 28 in San Angelo we will honor the 3 clubs with best retention for the first quarter (January, February, & March).

At the District meeting in July 2018, incoming District Governor Russell Livingston will present clubs \$10.00 for every member of the clubs who have the best retention between November 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018. We will also present the pins for best retention during the 2nd quarter of 2018.

Keys to member retention:

Know their name

Get them involved

Treat them as equals

Be careful with criticism and liberal with praise

Make sure they see the results of your clubs efforts

Make every member responsible for retaining members

IN 2017 TEXAS SAW THE HELP OF LCIF WHEN HURRICANE HARVEY DEVASTATED THE COAST AND HOUSTON AREA. A TASK FORCE WAS FORMED BY THE MD-2 COUNCIL OF GOVERNORS AND THE 4 MD DISTRICTS THAT WERE AFFECTED AND SO FAR LCIF HA\$ RECEIVED OVER \$916,000.00 IN DESIGNATED HURRICANE HARVEY CONTRIBUTIONS. THE TASK FORCE RECEIVED \$100,000 AS THE ORIGINAL CATASTROPHE GRANT WHICH WAS ALLOCATED \$25,000 PER DISTRICT WHICH AS BEEN SPENT ON EMERGENCY RELIEF ACTIVITIES. THE TASK FORCE ALSO RECEIVED \$60,000 AS THE HOLIDAY SPIRIT GRANT FOR PROVIDING ASSISTANCE TO FAMILIES AND CHILDREN FOR CHRISTMAS WHICH WAS ALLOCATED BETWEEN THE DISTRICTS. THE TASK FORCE HAS SUBMITTED ITS NEIGHBORHOOD RECONSTRUCTION GRANT FOR \$280,000 (\$70,000 PER DISTRICT) TO LCIF. THE PLAN IS TO ASSIST 20 HOMEOWNERS IN EACH DISTRICT WITH REPAIR COSTS OF MATERIALS NOT TO EXCEED \$3,000 PER HOMEOWNER. THIS HAS BEEN SUBMITTED TO LCIF FOR FINAL FAVORABLE APPROVAL. THE TASK FORCE ALSO RECEIVED APPROXIMATELY \$100,000 IN CONTRIBUTIONS FROM THE TEXAS LIONS FOUNDATION. THE HURRICANE IN PUERTO RICO ALSO RECEIVED A \$100,000 GRANT FROM LCIF PLUS ALL THE DONATIONS THAT CAME IN FOR THAT DISASTER.

LCIF IS ONE OF THE EIGHT CHARITIES THAT OUR DISTRICT 2-A1 SUPPORTS BY THE 100% VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS FROM THE 49 CLUBS IN OUR DISTRICT. FOR THE FIRST 6 MONTHS OF THIS YEAR 13 CLUBS HAVE BEEN 100%, ONE CLUB IS 200% AND ONE CLUB IS 1000%, 24 LIONS HAVE BECOME CONTRIBUTING MEMBERS, 3 MELVIN JONES FELLOWS WERE AWARDED TO DESERVING LIONS AND ONE TWO DIAMOND MELVIN JONES FELLOW PIN WAS AWARDED. WITH ALL THESE CONTRIBUTIONS AND DISASTER CONTRIBUTIONS BY CLUBS, DISTRICT 2-A1 HAS GIVEN \$7522.00 TO LCIF. OUT OF THE 16 DISTRICTS, DISTRICT 2-A1 IS IN 6th PLACE FOR GIVING. I WANT TO THANK EACH CLUB AND EACH LION WHO HAS SUPPORTED LCIF.

IT IS NOT TOO LATE TO BECOME A 100% VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTING CLUB. IT IS NOT TOO LATE TO BECOME A CONTRIBUTING MEMBER BY GIVING \$20, \$50, OR \$100 TO LCIF. 
