Also, two personal \$100.00 donations from Mr. Thomas and Mrs. Sherrilyn Blase, Mr. MP Butler and Mrs. Sheryl Sterling Butler.

We had five amazing Midland Lions clubs from Zone one that teamed up with the Big Spring Lions to host the Breakfast with Santa event, which benefitted the Lions Eye Bank. A check from the Breakfast with Santa was received in the amount of \$1601.00 given by the Midland Westside Lions.

Another milestone for WTLEBA was the establishment of a Lions relay transportation team to help expedite corneal tissue for processing. This transportation system covers districts 2A -l and 2T-3 and was put in place with the help of Lion Bill Lipham from the Odessa Downtown Lions club and Lion Bill Holubec from the East Angelo Lions club.

The year 2019 has started with a generous donation from Lion Al Owen in the amount of \$1,000.00 and a \$400.00 donation from the San Angelo Lighthouse. 


2019 Texas Lions Camp Harry Wickersham Golf Tournament Hole Sponsorship Camper – Elizabeth Gustafson
