Greeting Lions of 2A1

It has been all most a year since we started our journey together and things have been interesting to say the least. Let us look back at the activities of the 2019-2020 year.

In July 2019 we had our 1st Cabinet Meeting in San Angelo, there some 90 plus members were present. The membership slogan of “Just Ask One” was introduced, you were also introduced to the new district treasurer Joe Guerro and current secretary Donna Dugger. The meeting was a great success with enthusiasm running high.

October 2019, the 2nd Cabinet Meeting was held in Sweetwater and again some 65 plus members were present. We discussed the membership of 2A1 and announced that we were only down 26 members, this was a shortfall but not by as much as projected. The district lost 4 clubs which represented 24 members. I as District Governor visited 16 clubs to date. All visits were unique in their setting and procedures, but all were in the spirit of “WE Serve”.

In January 2020 we had the Mid-Winter Cabinet meeting in Kingsland , there were some 45 members present. The membership in 2A1 was not at all what was expected, we dropped 78 members. I can only attribute this to the age of our members and the lack of time and commitment by the younger generation. The club visits have continued with an additional 20 clubs being visited.

Harry Wickersham Golf Tournament Texas Lions Camp

Kids may not be on our campgrounds this summer, but TLC has not shut down. Our extremely exceptional Program Staff is taking Camp to your campers. The new program is called **TLC2U!** Boxes of supplies have already been sent out to campers and they will be attending classes, activities and programs on line with our staff. It looks like 2020 will still be a great summer for our kids.

I say that to let everyone know that we still have expenses to run our summer camp, plus our normal maintenance expenses on our buildings and all the year round costs we incur.

Over the last several years, the Harry Wickersham Golf Tournament has become a significant part of TLC's budgeted income, but with the pandemic most people have forgotten all about the tournament.

In 2018, the Harry Wickersham's 25th Anniversary, we surpassed the \$1,000,000 mark in funds raised by the tournament. Last year alone we raised another quarter of a million; but this year we are way behind, and the tournament is only a month away (July 30). Most of the money comes from \$100 Hole Sponsorships from individual Lions and Clubs. Sadly District 2A1 has almost always been on the bottom of the list with only 3-4 sponsorships for the whole District. Last year we moved up several spots, but this year we are right back bouncing off the bottom.

But it's not too late to turn it around. Do it for Past President Ebb Grindstaff, who played in this tournament many years. As a Past Chairman of the Board of TLC, Lion Ebb will likely have a big smile on his face, if we get 30-40 sponsorships before the tournament – so will a lot of kids who benefit from TLC. Also we still need teams to play, so golfers – it's not too late to sign up.

2020 Texas Lions Camp Harry Wickersham Golf Tournament Hole Sponsorship Camper – Joseph Dusl



The 2020 Texas Lions Camp Harry Wickersham Golf Tournament Camper Ambassador is Joseph Dusl. Joseph has attended TLC for the past 2 summers and loves TLC because it is a place where he belongs. For Joseph, TLC is a place he can do anything other kids can do and have tons of fun while doing it.

David, Joseph's father, explains that Joseph isn't always included in school or with other groups of kids. At TLC, Joseph not only is accepted, but encouraged and helped to try new things and to grow in his confidence and building friendships in the process.



Joseph was born with Spinocerebellar Ataxia, though a true diagnosis did not come until the age of 4. Spinocerebellar Ataxia, or SCA, is a degenerative disorder that shrinks the cerebellum. It affects a person's ability to balance,

talk, walk and other daily activities required to function independently. It is a rare condition affecting about 1 in 150,000 people.



Joseph was born without his cerebellum and because of his condition he has slow processing speed and does not learn as quickly as other kids. His dad said, "He can learn, just at his own speed and looking at things differently. He is determined and wants to be included." The family adapted for Joseph's needs both personally and socially. Making sure that Joseph had the medical care, educational assistance and adaptive tools for his day to day living at home and at school. Joseph's does not allow his physical limitations to inhibit him. You will find him running with his walker in tow, climbing on just about any piece of furniture and adventuring wherever he can roam.



"TLC was great at reinforcing that the way Joseph does things is okay and he can succeed. When Joseph first went to TLC, we were nervous because of his inability to communicate effectively and he had never spent a night away from us. TLC was so much fun that he cried when we picked him up because he didn't want to leave the friends he had made and the fun he was having. He was always included and being with kids his age

improved his social skills. His ability to sign was increased by living in a cabin with a camper who was hearing impaired. He also learned archery and received an award for it. It's nice that Joseph has a place to go where he's welcomed with open arms. It truly is a place where children can..."

TLC also offered Joseph's parents, David and Susan special time with his sister. David said, "Camps like Lions Camp provide parents an opportunity to explore and dedicate time to their other children or each other without feeling guilty about not including the child with challenges. He gets time away from us telling him what to do, and provides us a time to give his sister the extra attention that she loses because of all the help Joseph requires. It allows us to do activities we couldn't normally do. It's a win-win all around."
