

Concho Pearl Lions Club News


Concho Pearl Lions began meeting again June 8th and meet the 2nd and 4th Monday of each month at the San Angelo Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center building at 6:30pm. The 1st meeting we have a program and the 2nd meeting we have a business meeting along with a pre-packaged refreshment to celebrate the months birth-days. Although we are a small group we have continued to meet and also held a Christmas Party on December 14th at Rosas Cafe and Tortilla Factory where about 15 of us met, ate and exchanged gifts. Many of our members have been staying "in" in order to stay well and not expose themselves to taking a chance of catching the virus. Meetings have been running anywhere between 12-18 members and out of 30, at this time, that is a good turnout.

We have been making service donations each month along with the designated regular donations we budget for each year. Since funds were low we sold Rosas gift cards and held a Raffle. Our raffle consisted of a crocheted American Flag, crocheted by our own Lion, Lion Lynn Crisp, second prize was a Ring Doorbell and third prize was an artificial succulent. We also sold popcorn and water at the Craft Guild earlier this month. The fundraisers did well and will be followed up by other things after the 1st of 2021.

We added one new member who transferred from another District, Lion Frank Ciancarelli.

We pride ourselves (along with other clubs) in being a 100% club and supporting our Lions foundations. We budget each year to support other charities as well with a designated dollar amount. This year we gave to San Angelo Lions Charities Eyeglass Recycling Center, Meals for the Elderly, Concho Valley Home for Girls/Children's Shelter, Project Dignidad, Concho Valley Paws, West Texas Lions Eye Bank Alliance, Concho Valley Food Bank, and Keepers of Hope

We have been making monthly FOOD donations thru **Keepers of Hope** which works with the Food Banks of the Concho Valley, both the large one and the various small ones, plus the soup kitchen. In July we donated 43 cannisters of Oatmeal; August we donated 100 bags of rice; September we donated 94 jars of peanut butter; October we donated 232 cans of tuna and chicken; November we donated about 70 packages of various pastas; and for December we donated 64 cans of soup. We have also furnished Sandwich bags for the Soup Kitchen and Meals for the Elderly.


