Youth Exchange Update



Midland Northside and Midland West Side Lions Clubs are sponsoring three students on the Lions International Youth Exchange program this summer. Northside is sponsoring Ezekiel Bajomo, a junior at Trinity School while West Side is sponsoring Adam Bourland, a junior at Texas Leadership Charter Academy and a member of the scout troop affiliated with the club. The two clubs are jointly sponsoring Landen Dickens, a junior at Trinity School. Ezekiel has been accepted to go to Belgium and his flights and insurance have been organized. His host families have also been selected. Landen has been accepted to go to Italy, and his flights and insurance have been arranged. Adam has been accepted to Germany but we are still waiting on instructions before we can book his flights.

We are planning to host three 16 to 19 year old non-smoker girls in Midland from July 1 to 22. The host families will be Violet and Lion Mark Singh, Kim and Lion Frank Stowers, and Kris and Rod Curtis. They all live in Midland. Mark and Frank are members of the Midland Northside Lions Club. So far, we have accepted one student from Italy and one from France. We are still hoping for one more, but we will do the full program even if we have only two. The program of activities will include trips to Carlsbad Caverns, San Angelo, Abilene and Lubbock and visits to Texas Lions Camp, West Texas Lions Eye Bank and Texas Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center.

Before 6/15/23: Make sure club data is accurate for this year (2022-2023). For Example, new members, sponsors, new clubs formed, transfers and other end of year activities specific to clubs are correct and recorded in MyLion/MyLCI

- Make sure every member has an email listed and no shared emails can be used in the new LIONS PORTAL.
- Make sure member birthdays are entered since birth dates in MyLCI will be converted - even the old conversion 1/1/1900 date! Hint: in MyLCI under reports run "Member Information Update Report" and have your members update their info!

About the Harry Wickersham Golf Tournament – For 30 years, Texas Lions Camp has sponsored an annual Golf tournament to help support camp operations. The history of this Golf Tournament began with four Texas Lions (Lions Mike Butler, Marshall Cooper, Bruce Rickert and Harry Wickersham) coming to the Annual Board meeting of Texas Lions Camp (TLC) in Kerrville to enjoy fellowship with each other. They all loved to play golf and so what began on a \$10 per person gentlemen's donation at the Flying L Ranch Golf Course in Bandera, Texas, has grown into a major Fundraising event which generates more than \$100,000 annually for children with special medical conditions. Other Lions heard about the golf outing and dozens joined in to play in subsequent years including Lion Ed Stebbins who was recruited to help organize the event into an annual fund-raising opportunity. He made the original presentation to the TLC Board of Directors to make the Golf Tournament an annual fund-raising event as well as recommended that the event be named in honor of Lion Harry Wickersham (who was the real golfer in the original foursome). In addition, he recruited Lion Lester Frantzen as the Tournament Director and the Fredericksburg Lions Club to help organize and operate the tournament each year.
