Midland Northside and Midland West Side Lions Clubs are sponsoring three students on the Lions International Youth Exchange program this summer. Northside is sponsoring Ezekiel Bajomo, a junior at Trinity School while West Side is sponsoring Adam Bourland, a junior at Texas Leadership Charter Academy and a member of the scout troop affiliated with the club. The two clubs are jointly sponsoring Landen Dickens, a junior at Trinity School. Ezekiel has been accepted to go to Belgium and his flights and insurance have been organized. His host families have also been selected. Landen has been accepted to go to Italy, and his flights and insurance have been arranged. Adam has been accepted to Germany but we are still waiting on instructions before we can book his flights.

We are planning to host three 16 to 19 year old non-smoker girls in Midland from July 1 to 22. The host families will be Violet and Lion Mark Singh, Kim and Lion Frank Stowers, and Kris and Rod Curtis. They all live in Midland. Mark and Frank are members of the Midland Northside Lions Club. So far, we have accepted one student from Italy and one from France. We are still hoping for one more, but we will do the full program even if we have only two. The program of activities will include trips to Carlsbad Caverns, San Angelo, Abilene and Lubbock and visits to Texas Lions Camp, West Texas Lions Eye Bank and Texas Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center.

District 2-A1 Convention April 1,2023 San Angelo, TX

The District Convention of the District 2-A1 Cabinet was called to order by DG Carole Brown. Chaplain PDG Frank Berthold gave the Invocation. Second VDG Marianne Stevenson led the Pledges to the U.S. and Texas flags. First VDG Chris Maxwell introduced the guests and the PDGs in attendance:

PDG Al made the motion to suspend the rules so that all in attendance could vote. The Motion was seconded by PDG Glenn and approved by the group.

District Secretary Lion Helen Wilde announced there were copies of the January Cabinet Minutes on the tables. PCC Tom reported there is an error in Item 13 regarding the TLC budget. The Minutes show it to be \$5 million but he states it is closer to \$3 million. No other changes or corrections were noted. PCC Tom made the motion to accept the Minutes with corrections and IPDG Joel seconded. The motion passed.

District Treasurer Lion Nancy High asked if there were any questions on the Financial Statement. There were none so the report will be entered as submitted. Lion Nancy stated we need to sell District Raffle tickets today as the drawing will be held later in the meeting. She has deposited \$1785 so far and \$8000 had been budgeted as income from the raffle.

PCC John made the motion to elect this slate of officers by acclamation. Lion Donald McConnell seconded and the motion passed.

PCC Tom also explained the State ballot consists of 2 pages with 5 items to vote for. These are Amendments to the Constitution due to changes in the Global Action Team, Global Extension Team, and Global Membership Approach. DG Carole will take the State ballots to the State Convention in Ft. Worth in May to be counted.

PDG Keith introduced Emme Jordon, the winner of the Outstanding Youth Contest. She presented her paper on "How Technology Impacts Our Lives".

REPORTS:

- Zone 1 Lion Donn Dugger She reported Zone 1 clubs had distributed food boxes, participated in Roar with Laughter, vision screenings, and worked with Cub Scouts and Boy Scouts. They had also held raffles and bake sales.
- 2. Zone 2 Lion Shane Stevenson Zone 2 had held a hamburger supper.
- 3. Zone 3 Lion Larry Melton The Ballinger Club has gained 6 new members. The Ballinger Noon Club is also doing well with 3 new members. They are collecting aluminum cans, holding eyeglass recycling in the schools, and a pet vaccination clinic.
- 4. Zone 4 PDG Dave The clubs of Zone 4 are focusing on the needs of children.
- 5. Zone 5 PDG Glenn The Coleman Lions Club will be having a fall deer hunt. There will also be a cornhole tournament.
- 6. Zone 6 PDG Keith for Lion Theresa Cain The San Angelo Downtown Lions will celebrate their 100th anniversary on September 7, 2023. ID T. J. Tijerina will be the speaker. In true Lions spirit, pancakes and sausage will be served.

- 7. Diabetes Awareness Lion Dr. Leo Flores Dr. Dunagan has been working to get the cost of insulin reduced. In the last 3 months, the cost has gone from \$85 \$90 down to \$35. He is also working to get the price of insulin pumps reduced. Dr. Flores has reached out to Shannon Hospital to set up a diabetes/blood pressure screening but they will not return his call.
- 8. GLT Lion Felis Subia The Lions University will be held June 10 at 9 AM in San Angelo at the First Assembly of God Church, 1442 Edmund Blvd. Training will be given for Club President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer. Everybody is welcome. Applications for the Club Excellence Award are due by 08/31/23.
- 9. TLERC PDG Armando TLERC received \$1700 from a company in District T2 that buys glasses. They are in need of Clubs and individuals to volunteer.
- 10. Youth Exchange Lion Mark Singh Midland Northside and Midland West Side Clubs will be sponsoring students to go to Europe. One student has been accepted to come to Midland for the period 07/01 22/23.
- 11. GMA PDG Keith Yields his time to PCC Tom who in turn yields to Lion Donald.
- 12. TLC West Lion Donald The Lions Camp will be holding sessions this summer for resident campers, family units, and on-line sessions. The first work day will be in May. Volunteers are still needed. The Century Club is the backbone of financing the Camp. Become a member of the Step-Up Campaign. The 70th Anniversary Knife is out. Order forms are in the newsletter. PCC Tom said \$150 per Lion per year is needed to support the Camp. The Century Club has different levels of membership starting at \$10 per month. Lions license plates cost an extra \$35.
- 13. Lions State Museum Lion Sherrilynn Blasé Lion Whitney Livingston is in charge of the Museum. She was originally from District 2-A1. Two ways you can support the Museum are through an Ebb Grindstaff Fellow which costs \$500 and a Life Membership of \$100. Lion Norman Johnson of Districet 2-A1 will complete a mural for the Hodge Theatre.

15. LCIF & Global Membership – PDG Dave – Clubs should check the LCIF report which shows the money they have accumulated which can be used to purchase a Melvin Jones Fellow. He also presented awards to Lions who have given their time and effort outside of meetings. Awards went to: PDG Armando, IPDG Joel, Lion Nancy, Lion Helen, Lion Donald, Lion Lorean Sindelar, and Lion Donna.

Tailtwisters Lion Donald and Kathy McConnell drew for raffle prizes.

Chaplain PDG Frank led the Invocation for lunch.

DG Carole presented PID Sam Lindsey with a gift of goodies produced in the San Angelo area.

The DG said she had enjoyed the last few years. When you accept to run for Vice District Governors and Governor, they don't tell you that you need 2 bookcases for all the information. They don't tell you that you're going to have to buy a new wardrobe and that you will be told what to wear when. They don't tell you about all the neat people from around the United States and the World that you will meet. And they don't tell you that you will be going to Montreal Canada and come home with Covid. Lions do things in our communities and get thanked. We don't do it for the thanks but because "We Serve".

PID Sam Lindsey was elected to a 2-year term as International Director in 2016. He has also served as DG for District 2-X3, President of the Texas Lions Camp, and the Area F Chair for LCIF Campaign 100. During his 50 years as a Lion, he has received nine International Presidents Awards, an International Leadership Award, four extension awards, the Grand Master Key award, and is a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow. PID Sam has received the Ambassador of Goodwill Award, the highest recognition conferred by Lions Clubs International and has been inducted into the Lions of Texas Hall of Fame.

PID Sam said in 2013 Lions began to vaccinate children against meales. This initiative was started by PIP Barry Palmer in Hamburg Germany. At that time there were about 465 children dieing each day due to complications from measles. Bill and Melinda Gates then set up a matching grant to also help eradicate the disease. When Ebb Grindstaff was International President, there were approximately 45,000 Lions in Texas. We're less than half that number today. We need to build our membership. Remember the more we serve, the more members we will attract. Our opportunities to serve are endless.

Before 6/15/23: Record any club or donations to LCIF are in the bank with the appropriate supporting documentation for recognition.


