
PDG Armando Subia Sr.

Armando was born August 10, 1949, in Monahans, Texas, to his parents, Ygnacio U. Subia Sr. and Ofelia Lujan Subia. Armando was of strong faith and was God's warrior. He had a heart of service and never met a stranger. Armando was married to his high school sweetheart Felis Aguilar since 1969. Armando and Felis moved to Midland in 1970, where he worked for Ft. Worth Pipe for 24 years, becoming the company's youngest and only Hispanic Manager. Armando was a retired Oncology-Medical Surgery Registered Nurse who worked for Midland Memorial Hospital for 18 years. He also served with Lions International since 2005 in multiple positions. DISTRICT 2A-1 VISION SCREENING UPDATE December 2023

'WE SERVE'

AGAIN a big "THANK YOU" to all those who are using their personal time to do Vision Screening. It is a big commitment and not everyone has time to offer to do it, but we are LIONS and service is our motto. THANK YOU TO: Big Spring, Kingsland, Llano, Mason, Midland, San Angelo, and Sweetwater. These clubs have gone out of their way to help screen areas that normally they would not do. However, although requested by emails to those with cameras, I still have areas that have not reported their screening information. We have cameras in our district still not accounted for. We have areas we do not have anyone screening (Brownwood is one) and areas that need assistance with screening (Midland). WE MUST WORK AS A TEAM TO ACHIEVE OUR GOALS. Our goal is EVERY CHILD SCREENED.

Letters are ready to go out after January 1, 2024 to all the day cares in Brownwood and Midland Areas and other areas as well requesting permission for our teams to screen their children. There are 59 day cares in Midland plus private schools, parochial schools as well as approximately 14 in the Brownwood area. THESE ARE OUR DISTRICT. IT IS OUR SERVICE DUTY TO REACH OUT TO THEM and try to reach as many of those children as possible. An adult is important also but by adult age not much correction can be made except by glasses or surgery for the rest of their lives.

The San Angelo Vision Screening Team ended December screening over 3500 children between August and September. Kuddos to those team members for sticking with it and reaching out to many. There are still those that will be screened after the 1st of the year who are reaching out to the Lions.

I have been inquiring of all screeners if they have tried certain towns, daycares, etc. I am sure that we need to EXPAND our reach and screen as many children as possible. In repetition of the last update: I estimate that in District 2A-1 we have about 15,000 children we should be screening. I do have listings of all daycares and school districts in each of the District's counties and in each town there are usually other daycares (churches, private schools, parochial schools) that we can Google and find information on and contact them. How many of the clubs contact those in their area to see if they can do Vision Screening? Maybe you do not have a camera, but you have the manpower to assist in a screening, reach out to the clubs listed above, we are Lions, we are here to serve, we will assist. REACH OUT, our recommendations could help correct vision in young children's eyes.

<u>VSP Eyes of Hope Gift Certificates:</u> As I stated in the last newsletter we are the recipients of certificates (vouchers) for free exams and glasses thru the VSP Eyes of Hope program. As District Sight Chair I ordered and received them from LCI. We have VSP doctors in San Angelo, Midland, Big Spring, Brownwood, Early, Colorado City, Kerrville, and Marble Falls who currently participate in this program. I have not had any club that has requested a certificate which will be distributed on a request only basis. <u>Information needed from club is recipient's name, address, phone and date of birth.</u> They are available for both children and adults. I have used several of these vouchers in San Angelo. They are for folks who are in need and are not on any government assistance program which offers Vision Services.

Let the Celebration begin! The 1st event to celebrate the Lions Camp' birthday will be held on February 3rd, 2024 in conjunction with the Camp's Semi-Annual Board Meeting and the 3rd Council of Governors' weekend in Kerrville. The Past District Governors' Association has designated their Saturday evening banquet at the Y.O. as TLC's 75th Birthday Party, where the guest speaker will be Past International President Douglas Alexander. Tickets are now available on line. (Go to Texas Lions.org, Council Meetings, 2023-24 3rd Council of Governors Meeting or you can go to pdgtxlions.com). There will be a social hour with pre-dinner music prior to the banquet.

The Kerrville Chamber of Commerce will be hosting their monthly wine and cheese party on the Texas Lions Camp campus on March 21st to celebrate our 75th anniversary. We hope to have some Federal, State, and local proclamations to honor the occasion, as well as local dignitaries and possibly our State &/or Federal Representatives.

Next up is the past Counselors & Campers Homecoming (March 22-24). This will be a great opportunity for reminiscing and touring the camp to see all the changes that have been made in the camp over the years. A complete outline of events and the registration form will be available on the camp website. If you know any past staff members, counselors, or campers, please contact them to let them know about this fun event....and while you are at it invite them to come to one of your meetings, many of these folks have never been invited to join a Lions Club.

Since April 4, 1949 is the date the State of Texas officially incorporated us, our main event will be on the campus of TLC from April 5-8. Lions will be offered the opportunity to stay on campus in our bunkhouses. There will be a nightly fee, but meals will be included. As you may recall Kerrville is virtually "dead center" for the April 8th total eclipse. Rooms in town, if available, are \$500-\$600/night and likely grocery stores and restaurants will run out of food. So here's a chance to celebrate, have some fun, and enjoy the eclipse; and on the 5th, 6th & 7th from 4pm-9pm, TLC will host a Musical Festival at the Kerr County Youth Exhibit Center across the highway from the camp. Eric Pasley, a former TLC camper, will be our headliner. All of this culminating with one of Mother Nature's most spectacular events on April 8th – a total eclipse.

One thing I think we should remember, as we celebrate our successes of the past, is that this is like our Lion's logo: one Lion looking backwards and one looking forward. Our celebrations are looking to the past, things that are done. For Century Club - It's "Service from the Heart"

If you aren't a member of the TLC Century Club, please "Sign Up"; if you are a member, consider "Stepping Up" to the next level; and if you were a member but dropped out, consider "Catching Up" (i.e., come back in).

What is Texas Lions Camp Century Club? It's an individual annual giving program, and as such, it is giving from you own heart, independent of Club budgets or fund raisers. It is one of the life bloods of our operating budget, that in normal times sends up to 1500 children with special needs to Texas Lions Camp each summer, and yet less than 5% of Texas Lions are members.

Who can be a Century Club Member? Anyone can be a member. You don't have to be a Lion. It can be family or friends. You can even be a non-Texan, but it is our Texas Lions who are the backbone of the Century Club.

What does it cost to be a member? You can give your gift annually, or you can give monthly. A Bronze member is \$100 (\$10 if monthly); Silver is \$250; Gold \$500; Diamond is \$1,000; & Ambassador is \$5,000. Membership automatically renews each year, so members should join with the intention of making their same gift each year or even increasing their level.

How do I enroll or Step Up? Go to www.lionscamp.com, click on "Get Involved" and go to "Donate Now". There you will find "Ways to Give". Click that open and select "Century Club". If you scroll down, you will see the option to enroll online or to download and print out the form to send to the Camp directly.

Sign Up, Step Up, Catch Up is a drive to beef up our Century Club membership for the Texas Lions Camp, as a birthday present to Texas Lions Camp on it's 75th Anniversary in 2024. Today we have half the number of Texas Lions, supporting twice the number of campers at over twice the cost, as we did some 30 years ago. If we reach our goal of an increase of \$60/mo. among the members of EACH club in Texas, we will generate an additional of \$575,000 ANNUALLY, which would generate 15% of our operating budget, and help us keep serving our special children into the future.

A \$60 increase from the members of each Texas Club is doable. "Signing Up" as a new Bronze member is a \$10/mo. increase (\$100 if pd. ann.); a new Silver is \$21/mo. (\$250/yr.); a Gold is \$42/mo.(\$500); etc. Likewise, "Stepping Up" from Bronze to Silver is an \$11/mo. increase; Bronze to Gold is a \$32/mo. increase; going from Silver to Gold is a \$21/mo. increase, etc.
